1. Online forums for discussion and Gospel Communities.

Below I have included the reading plan along with some questions to begin the process of studying together.

I want to share with you a few questions that will spark conversation as you read the text. Try to think of these questions in terms of Head, Heart, and Hands.

Head: Questions of the head help us to understand what is going on.

- What happened in this story?
- Who are the main characters?
- What was interesting in this story?

Heart: Questions of the heart help us apply that to my own personal walk with Jesus.

- Why is this story important for us to know?
- What does this story teach me about Jesus?
- What do I need to understand about knowing Jesus after reading this passage?
- Who am I most like in this story and Why?

Hands: Questions of the hands help us think about how we can practically be obedient to God's word.

- What is the main point of this story?
- What do I need to do, say, or think differently because of this passage?
- How can I share these things with other people?
